This lecture addresses issues surrounding gender equality and violence against women. Tony Porter draws deeply on his experiences growing up in working class neighborhoods in New York City coupled with a sharp sense of empathy and talent for communication. He has set these experiences and skills to purpose, working for over twenty years as an activist and an educator, seeking to affect social justice in the United States and around the world.

Tony Porter is an author, educator and activist working to advance social justice issues. As the co-founder of A Call To Men, Tony is internationally recognized for his efforts to prevent violence against women while promoting a healthy, respectful manhood. Tony's 2010 TED Talk has been named by GQ Magazine as one of the "Top 10 TED Talks Every Man Should See." Tony is an advisor to the National Football League, National Basketball Association, National Hockey League, and Major League Baseball, providing policy consultation, working extensively with player engagement, and facilitating violence prevention and healthy manhood training.
